Jack Wagman, Class of 1932, has been a long-standing generous supporter of the Alumni Association. Fifty-six years ago, at the time of the great stock market crash and much unemployment, things were very tight financially. Jack Wagman fondly remembers the generosity of his classmates who saw to it that someone paid the \$20 required for the senior trip to Washington, D.C. enabling Jack to join his classmates.

Jack moved to Los Angeles and became a prosperous businessman. When he sold his sign manufacturing business, he and his wife, Norma, retired to Las Vegas, Nevada. He has been in constant touch with his classmates over the years.

We in the Alumni Association are proud to have Jack Wagman as a member. A plaque will be given to the Wagnans, with a duplicate placed in the high school building, which will list the yearly recipients of the Jack and Norma Wagman Scholarship.

4 FROM CHS NAMED TO HOCKEY HALL OF FAME

Four graduates of CHS were recently named to the United States Field Hockey Association Hall of Fame. This means that CHS will have more players in the Hall than any secondary school in the nation.

Adele Boyd, '49, played on the U.S. national team from 1959 until injuring her knee in 1966. She also played on touring teams in England, West Germany and Jamaica. Boyd also served as a Panther coach, and for the past 17 years has been head coach at Ursinus College. She has had 16 winning seasons at Ursinus.

Joan Moser, '64, played in only one losing game in four years at Ursinus. She played for 10 years on the U.S. team, while helping the Raybestos Brakettes win a world title in softball in 1974. Moser now coaches the Ursinus softball team and previously coached North Penn High to 14 Bux-Mont titles in 17 years and three PIAA Class AAA crowns ('78, '81 and '85.) Moser is still active in indoor hockey and helped her team win a national title this year. She also earned MVP honors at the JFK Tournament in 1986.

Ruth Heller Aucott, '52, made the U.S. team seven times in the 50's and 60's! She played with touring teams in Australia and The Netherlands. Since her retirement, Aucott has umpired on the local, sectional and national level.

Elinore Pepper, '42, played on the U.S. team six times between 1947 and 1963 — a span of an unbelievable 18 years! She also was a CHS Phys. Ed. teacher for several years. Pepper started as a dealer and is now a pit boss at Harrah's Casino in Atlantic City. She has also been a photographer, artist and sculptor!

The Field Hockey Hall of Fame operated under a point system which required at least 21 points for election. Points are awarded for each year of participation on the U.S. national team, an Olympic team, an international tournament team or a touring squad. The Hall will be permanently housed at Ursinus College.

The celebration began on Friday night when some class members met at the Yorktown Inn. Richard Klein, Master of Ceremonies, showed a video using film from the 1952 Class Picnic and Washington Trip and important events of the year. The terrific weekend ended with a Sunday brunch.

Class of 1963 . . . Lulu Country Club hosted the 25th reunion of the Class of 1963, on Saturday evening, April 23rd. Classmates were showered with mementos such as booklets, buttons, mugs, and a class picture of the 156 people in attendance. Blue and gold balloon centerpieces with triangular bases made from yearbook pictures adorned the tables. A videotape is being made of the evening.
