### Panthers claw ghosts

Break out the old blue and gold pom-poms and give a cheer, Cheltenham beat Abington 36 - 0 for the first time since 1981. Yes, you read that correctly, for just the 23d time in the 72-game series the Panthers have prevailed. The game, played for the first time on Thanksgiving morning since the 1950's, drew a large crowd of loyal alumni fans who had arrived in town for the many class reunions which were to be held during the next few days. The Chelts' victory was the second most lopsided in the long history of this neighborhood rivalry. The Panthers used a punishing ground game that produced 187 yards on 32 carries for senior fullback Chad Levitt and a defensive effort that head coach Joe Gro acknowledged as their finest of Cheltenham limited the season. Abington to 91 total yards and five first downs for the game.

Using a more improved method for dating ancient bones that he developed, Dr. McKinney has established that bones discovered in Midland, Texas in 1953 date back 11,600 years. These bones are the oldest ever found in the Americas.

Ronald Sessions, '67 is the specials editor for Road & Track magazine.

Martin Laub, '62 was recently elected a Pennsylvania State Representative from the 153rd Assembly District representing Abington and Rockledge. This is the seat recently vacated by Montgomery County Commissioner Jon Fox, '66.

Michael Skloff, '77 recently completed the music for the musical adaptation of the movie Arthur. Skloff's talents can also be heard on

the main theme music for HBO's new show *Dreamin*.

Peter S. Eagleson, ScD '45 a professor in the Department of Civil Engineering at MIT, was recently presented the James R. Killian, Jr. Faculty Achievement Award. The award recognizes extraordinary professional accomplishments and service to MIT. Dr. Eagleson is recognized internationally for his work in hydrology and hydroclimatolgy.

Donald H. Robinson, M.D., '36 writes a syndicated column entitled Robinson on Parallel. The column is now in its 35th year and deals with aging and the elderly.

Roger Servin, '47 recently published a book entitled KIS Fitness A Keep It Simple Approach to Staying Young, Healthy and Fit. Roger, a long time body builder and fitness expert, believes that "fitness doesn't cost...it pays."

Michael Greenspan, '65 is currently the host of a weekly cable show, "Jerusalem On Line" that presents the people and stories behind the news from Israel. The show can be seen all over North America except Philadelphia, the only major market that does not run his show.

## Reggie Jackson elected to Hall of Fame

Reggie Jackson '64, an original inductee into the Cheltenham High School Alumni Hall of Fame, was recently elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, N.Y. in his first year of eligibility. The former four sport star at CHS found fortune and fame as one of the greatest homerun hitters in the history of baseball. Known as "Mr. October", Jackson's star shone brightest when his teams reached post-season play. Eleven times in his 21 years, Jackson's teams - in Oakland, New York and California made it to the playoffs. Five times they played in the World Series, and four times they won. In 27 World Series games, he hit .357, knocked in 24 runs and hit 10 home runs. Perhaps his greatest day was October 18, 1977 in the sixth and final game of the World Series between the Yankees and the Dodgers. He went to the plate four times, walked on four pitches the first time, then homered on the first pitch against three different Dodgers pitchers the next three times. The Yankees won the game 8-4 and Jackson was named MVP. Jackson finished his career in 1987 with 563 home runs, sixth on the all-time list.

### The Return of the Brecker Brothers

Cheltenham's Brecker '67 and Randy Brecker '63 -The Brecker Brothers have reunited with a new CD, Return of the Brecker Brothers, released on GRP Records. The album has been nominated for a Grammy Award in the category - Best Contemporary Jazz Performance, Instrumental. In addition, two selections from the CD have earned individual Grammy nominations. During their recent reunion tour, the brothers made a one night stop, December 5, 1992, at the Keswick Theatre in Glenside. Playing before a house filled with friends, classmates and relatives was a special night for all in attendance. Randy, who started as a

trumpeter in Blood Sweat & Tears has put out three solo albums in the last six years. Michael, is coming off 15 months with Paul Simon's "Born at the Right Time" tour which included 172 concerts around the world. It more importantly exposed the Grammy Award winning Michael to the musical influences from Africa that are reflected in some of the cuts on their new album.

Michael was also seen recently at the pre-inaugural festivities in Washington D.C. for that other tenor sax player. Joining a line of the nations top ten saxophone players, Michael soloed for the President-elect on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial.

### In Memoriam . . .

Since our last Panther's Tale, the Cheltenham community has lost four of its oldest and dearest friends; Barbara Ball Portner, '52, Herman M. Wessel, C. Robert Cunningham and Ralph Garreth.

Barbara Ball Portner died August 8, 1992, after fighting a long battle with a brain tumor. Portner was the co-founder of the Cheltenham High School Alumni Association. She served the Association as Vice-President and President. Having taught elementary school for several years and having raised her three children, Portner served for four years on the Cheltenham Board of School Directors. Since graduation from Cheltenham and Temple University, she had served the Class of '52 as their reunion chairperson on several occasions.

Herman M. Wessel November 16, 1992, at the age of 94. A teacher and administrator in the personable principal of Elkins Park Junior High School. "He had a fantastic memory for students and their families," recalled longtime friend and colleague, Harry Pellegrini. A longtime supporter of the Cheltenham High School Alumni Association, Dr. Wessel was influential in the selection process for the Alumni Hall of Fame.

C. Robert Cunningham, director of guidance, teacher and coach at Cheltenham High School for over 40 years, died September 14, 1992, at the age of 81. Mr. Cunningham, who came to Cheltenham from Franklin and Marshall College along with Wilbur "Dutch" Lehman in the early 30's, coached the football and baseball teams for years. He was chairman of the history department in which he also taught. Mr. Cunningham was the founder of the very successful domestic exchange program that annually permitted a large group of juniors to 1992, at the age of 86. Mr. Garreth, the diminutive dynamo, taught history and business courses for 34 years before his retirement in 1970. During his tenure he served as chairman of the business education department while teaching business law, typing, and bookkeeping. Mr. Garreth also coached the baseball and golf teams as well as serving as the schools equipment manager.

All four of these individuals have made significant contributions to School, Cheltenham High the Cheltenham High School Alumni Association, the students of the Cheltenham School District and the Cheltenham community in general. They will all be sadly missed.
