She was an active member of the Animal Rights organization, co-chair of Student Council's Charities Committee and a member of the National Honor Society. #### HIGH SCHOOL PARK DEDICATED

fter months of demolition, the High School Road and Montgomery Avenue site that once was the address of Cheltenham High School now stands as High School Park. A fire in January of 1994 reduced the front building to rubble, while years of neglect turned the main high school building into a dangerous structure that had to be torn down. The Cheltenham Township Board of Commissioners, utilizing funds from the Montgomery County Open Space Initiative, purchased the property from developers in order to convert the eleven-acre space into passive park land.

On October 28, 1995, a dedication ceremony was held in which the open space was officially named "High School Park." Early snows and the severe winter prevented the completion of the project's grading and seeding. The anticipated completion date for this first stage of the project is late April. The Township has received help in this venture from the Friends of High School Park who expect to hire a planner to assist in the development of the space. Events for the park are now in the planning stages. These would include an Earth Day Clean-up and a clothesline art show. The president of this organization is Joe Burke. If you would like to contribute to their cause, Mr. Burke can be reached at (215) 635-1913.

According to Township Commissioner Tom Ellis, '77, some sort of memorial will be erected on the grounds "so that people won't forget that once on this site stood Cheltenham High School." The graduates of Cheltenham High School have already made sure of that.
