Lights installed at CHS Stadium

September, 1959 marked the opening of the current Cheltenham High School building in Wyncote, PA. It is the fourth structure to serve as Cheltenham Township's high school.

The first graduating class of 1960 started their high school education at the "old" building located at High School Road and Montgomery Avenue in Elkins Park. When they marched down the isle at graduation it marked a new beginning for CHS.

To celebrate this momentous occasion, the high school is planning a year-long celebration. The community is invited to the first Jubilee event scheduled for Friday, September 11th The celebration will begin at 6:00 p.m. with a parade of alumni, School District and Township dignitaries, students and contributors to the Stadium Lights Project following behind the Panthers Marching Band. The night will be filled with Panther Pride. The parade will lead up to the CHS Stadium where for the first time in CHS history, lights will shine on the football team for its game against Bishop McDevitt.

A fter fifty-two years, Glenside Elementary School will be demolished over the summer. A new two story building will be built on the same site and is expected to be completed in two years. The building had many deficiencies including a deteriorating heating system, deteriorating electrical, plumbing and roofing systems. The school was also not in compliance with ADA requirements and had safety code issues.

Starting in September, students will attend modular classrooms that will be known as Glenside Elementary Modulars. (GEM) The modulars are located next to Elkins Park School.

A "Goodbye Reception/Walkthrough was held on June 23rd so that current and former students, teachers, administrations and area residents could take one last look at the school. Decades of memorabilia were on display throughout the building.

CLASS OF 1988 TAKES HOLLYWOOD BY STORM

Turn on your television and flip channels on any given night, and the chances are good that you will come across a TV show or movie involving a member of the talented Class of 1988.

Most visible these days is **Rebecca Creskoff**, who co-stars in the new HBO series Hung, which debuted this summer. Previously, she starred in sitcoms Greetings from Tuscon and Quintuplets. Rebecca also has had guest roles in some of the most popular shows over the last 10 years, including Law & Order, Law & Order: Special Victims Unit, The West Wing, The New Adventures of Old Christine, Mad Men, Navy NCIS and Terminator: The Sarah Connor Chronicles. In 2000, she had a memorable recurring role on The Practice, as ill-fated psychiatrist Jeannie Reynolds.

Behind the scenes is mover-and-shaker **Andrew Kosove**, who in 1997 co-founded Alcon Entertainment LLC, a movie production company. Alcon (named for a mythological archer who never missed his target) develops, finances and markets feature films. Alcon has co-produced films in all genres with some of Hollywood's biggest stars, including Al Pacino and Robin Williams (Insomnia), Ashton Kutcher and Jennifer Garner (Dude, Where's My Car?), and Denzel Washington (Brothers in Arms, presently in production). He also has worked with Oscar winner Hilary Swank on three different films, including 2007 hit P.S. I Love You. For the kids, he has co-produced Racing Stripes and is reported to be working on big-screen adaptations of cartoon classics Marvin the Martian and Hong Kong Phooey. Andrew also co-produced the two Sisterhood of the Traveling Pants movies.

Andrew has had such an impact that, on June 30, 2009, he was one of 134 individuals invited to join the Academy of Motion Pictures Arts and Sciences, the organization responsible for voting on and presenting the Academy Awards. According to the Academy's press release, invitations are extended to individuals "who have distinguished themselves by their contributions to theatrical motion pictures." Andrew is in very good company as an invitee this year, as he is joined by Hollywood heavyweights such as Hugh Jackman, Anne Hathaway and Slumdog Millionaire director Danny Boyle.

Perhaps best-known from the Class of '88 is writer/producer **Josh Goldsmith**, who later this year will become the youngest inductee in Cheltenham's Hall of Fame. Josh, with wife Cathy Yupsa, was the head writer and executive producer for long-running sitcom. The King of Queens. Josh presently is writer and executive producer of 'til Death, a sitcom that features a high school based on Cheltenham. On the big screen, Josh and his wife co-wrote the Jennifer Garner vehicle 13 Going on 30 and the smash hit What Women Want, which starred Mel Gibson and Helen Hunt and earned nearly \$400 million worldwide.

One can only hope that one of these days; all three of these accomplished entertainers will share the credits on a project together.

BOOK REVIEW

Josh Winheld, '96 chronicles his life with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy in a book entitled <u>Worth the Ride</u>. It was more than worth the read. I stayed up until two in the morning to finish the book. In this book it is hard to decide what impresses you the most-the intelligence, the wit, the strength of character, the grit, the honesty, or the humanity. Josh's experience impressed me as a rollercoaster ride: as soon as things looked up, they would take a downward turn, or go up again and yet Josh and his family always seem to weather the ride with equanimity.

It was particularly interesting to read about his journey because of his membership in the Cheltenham community. The characters, the institutions are part of the Cheltenham neighborhood fabric, and in reading the book, you will find yourself recognizing parts of your own past. Yet Josh's story certainly has universal appeal that goes way beyond Cheltenham. In reading the book, I kept thinking of more and more people to whom I wanted to recommend it. It has so much to offer everyone.

In my opinion Josh Winheld's inspirational autobiography should be added to the high school summer reading list.
