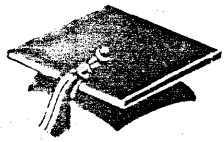

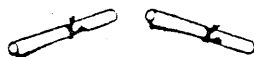
Both ceremonies will be held in the high school gymnasium and are open to the public.

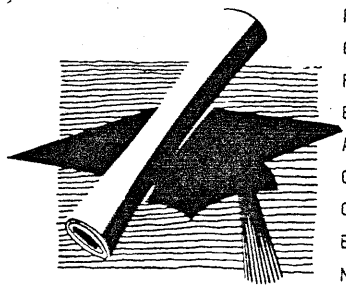
Senior Puzzle

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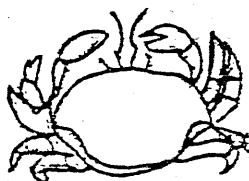
