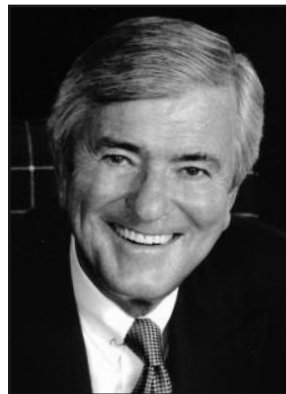




KBHSAA to Honor 2012 Distinguished Alumni on June 23rd



LLOYD JOHN OGILVIE - CLASS OF 1948

Lloyd John Ogilvie won national competitive speech championships during high school and a four-year scholarship at Lake Forest College. In 1952 he began theological training at Garrett Theological Seminary in Evanston, IL and did his Post-Graduate studies at New College, University of Edinburgh, Scotland. After his ordination, he served as the first Pastor of Winnetka Presbyterian Church; Senior Pastor of The First Presbyterian Church of Bethlehem, PA; and Senior Pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Hollywood, CA.

His radio and television ministry called "Let God Love You" eventually went national with over a million viewers. He has written 54 books and was General Editor of the 32-volume "Communicator's Commentary of the Bible."

Dr. Ogilvie was elected the 61st Chaplain of the U.S. Senate. He served as nonpartisan, nonpolitical spiritual leader and counselor of the Senate from 1995-2003. After retirement, Fuller Theological Seminary established the Lloyd John Ogilvie Institute of Preaching. Dr. Ogilvie has led seminars on "Preaching With Passion," as well as conferences and retreats for educational, business and religious leaders.



ERNIE PELLEGRINO, M.D. - CLASS OF 1957

Ernie Pellegrino became an orthopedic surgeon in 1969 after getting his Bachelor's and Medical Doctorate at UW-Madison. He served two years in the U.S. Air Force at Sheppard's Air Force Base.

Dr. Pellegrino practiced orthopedics at the Dean Clinic and St. Mary's Hospital Medical Center, where he became Chief of Staff after serving as chairman of the surgery departments of both institutions. He has had articles published in a number of medical and orthopedic journals through the years and was on the teaching staff of the UW Medical School for over three decades. He also served on the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeon's Midwest Region Membership Committee for several years. Upon retirement, he and his wife did volunteer work in Tanzania, Africa in both 1998 and 2000, where he taught orthopedic operations.

In 2001, he founded the Benevolent Specialist Project Free Clinic for the uninsured, a multi-specialty clinic of over 35 volunteer doctors. It is the only such clinic in Wisconsin and only one of a few in the nation. He acquired a Florida License eight years ago to be able to do volunteer work during the months he lives there.



DAN VACCARO - CLASS OF 1969

After graduation, Dan Vaccaro attended UW-Parkside and majored in Biology. He now teaches there as an Associate Lecturer in Scuba Diving. He and his high school sweetheart, Kathleen, married and later started Diver Dan's Scuba Center. They have been in business for 28 years in Kenosha.

In addition to teaching Red Cross classes, Dan is a Master Instructor Trainer for five training agencies and instructs in more than 22 specialties. He has taught divers for the military, law enforcement, fire/rescue, technical and recreational sectors. Dan volunteers as a member of Scout Leaders Rescue Squad and Kenosha County Underwater Rescue and Recovery Dive Team. He holds the rank of Assistant Chief/Divemaster. Dan has earned numerous volunteer and community service awards on local, state, and national levels.

Dan has been an instructor at the Emergency Services Midwest Conference & Exposition, the S.E. Wisconsin Medical Reserve Corps Community Preparedness Conference, and is a frequent guest speaker and trainer in Aquatic Recreation and Fire/Rescue fields.



JOHN CHARLES WAVRO - CLASS OF 1957

John Wavro attended University of Wisconsin on a football/baseball scholarship. He served on active duty with Wisconsin National Guard during the Berlin Crisis. In 1963, he married Judith Schuetz (BHS Class of 1960). That same year, he and Judy purchased a small soft drink distribution company. For the next 39 years, the company distributed beer, soft drinks and water to retail supermarkets, taverns and liquor stores in the Kenosha market. The company expanded in 1975 with the purchase of the May Beverage Company.

In 1978, Mr. Wavro was invited to join the Kenosha Rotary Club and remains an active member today. He counts as his most gratifying accomplishment the construction of the Rotary Miracle Field - a baseball field designed to be used for physically handicapped kids - a little known, must-see venue which was the first such diamond built in Wisconsin. He has also served on numerous other civic organizations.

In 2002, they sold the business and retired. They are active in their community through the John & Judy Wavro Charitable Trust, Bradford Alumni and YMCA Scholarships, St. Joseph H.S., and the Bradford Athletic Department.

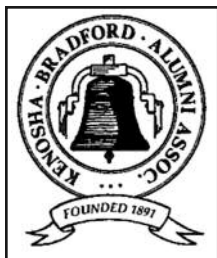

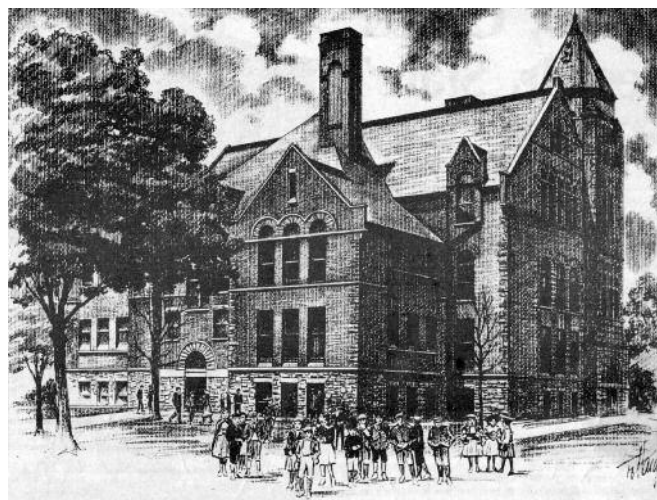
