



KBHSAA to honor 2022 Distinguished Alumni



CHARLES "CHUCK" H. HEIDE, CLASS OF 1940

Chuck completed his B.S. in mechanical engineering from Iowa State University in 1947, after serving in the U.S. Army Signal Corps during World War II. His professional career consisted of over 60 years of product design, development and engineering with leading manufacturers of technology-based systems in the aerospace, automotive and heating industries. In 1982, Chuck joined Vesta, Inc. in Franklin, WI. For the next 25 years, he initiated systems for the efficient processing of molded and extruded silicone rubber medical components.

Chuck was a member of Bethany Lutheran Church and served on the board of directors for Hawthorn Hollow Aboretum. He was committed to alternative energy projects, installing a wind generator and two solar panel arrays in Somers. Shortly before his death in 2021, he founded the HEIDE (Heide Educational Institute for Dark Skies and Desert Environment) in southwest Texas to provide learning opportunities in astronomy and rugged terrain exploration for high school and college students.

Chuck's lifelong interests included aviation, astronomy, photography, renewable energy sourcing, history, and reading. In his own words, "I am so indebted to Kathryn, my wife of 63 years, my family and the many good people who made my life interesting. Thank you for your contributions to me."

MARK POCAN, CLASS OF 1982

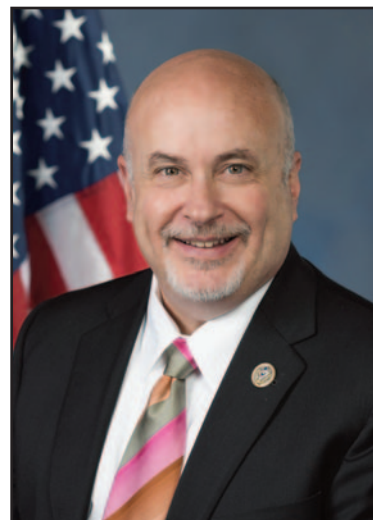
Mark Pocan was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 2012, representing Wisconsin's second district. Prior to serving in Congress, Mark served on the Dane County Board of Supervisors (1991-1996) and as State Representative of Wisconsin's 78th Assembly district (1998-2012).

A small business owner, union member and lifelong advocate for progressive causes, Mark has used his unique experience from the private and public sector to fight for his constituents. In Congress, Representative Pocan serves on the Appropriations Committee, the Committee on Education and Labor and the Joint Economic Committee. He has also held leadership roles on the Congressional Progressive Caucus and the Congressional Labor Caucus.

Born and raised in Kenosha, Mark learned about hard work from his parents, who each ran their own small business. At age 8, he got his start in politics delivering literature door-to-door for his father, a long-time Kenosha alderman. Mark graduated from UW-Madison in 1986 with a degree in Journalism. He followed in his parents' footsteps and opened Budget Signs & Specialties in 1988, a union specialty printing shop he continues to run today.

Classmates may recall his Bradford Variety Show performances as a magician. Today, Mark still performs magic and does "Magic Monday" videos explaining Washington, DC and posts it on social media.

Mark and his husband, Phil, were married in 2006 and live in the Town of Vermont in Dane County.



SUSAN M. SHEMANSKE, CLASS OF 1973

Susan Shemanske, a member of National Honor Society at Bradford, graduated third in her class and was on staff for the Inferno and Spy. She attended Marquette University from 1973-1975 and graduated from UW-Parkside with high honors in May 1977 with a BA in Communications.

Susan joined *The Journal Times* in Racine in 1978 as a sports writer. She was promoted to Sports Editor in 1990 – the first woman to hold that position with a Wisconsin daily newspaper – a role in which she served until March 2018, supervising a staff of 11. She covered high school, college and professional sports, including the Milwaukee Brewers and MLB, for 39 years. A lifetime member of the Baseball Writers Association of America, she was the first woman voted into the BBWAA Milwaukee Chapter in 1984 and has been a voting member for the National Baseball Hall of Fame since 1994. Susan was inducted into the Wisconsin Newspaper Hall of Fame in 2019 and has won numerous Associated Press and Wisconsin Newspaper Association awards. She served as panelist and guest speaker for the Midwest Press Institute and as a volunteer for Racine YMCA Lighthouse Run and Wisconsin Special Olympics.

Since 2013, Shemanske and her husband, Peter Wicklund, have been part of the ownership group of the *Washington Island Observer*, a weekly newspaper in Door County.

Bradford Alumni Association announces 15 Scholarships offered for 2022

Bradford seniors planning to attend a 4-year college/university are encouraged to apply for the Kenosha Bradford High School Alumni Association (KBHSAA) Scholarships. Applicants are to meet general eligibility requirements for the individual scholarships unless otherwise specified. College GPA of 2.0 or greater on a 4.0 scale is required unless otherwise specified.

Seniors are asked to download and complete the [KBHSAA Scholarship Application](#) and submit it along with a copy of their high school transcript, to Mr. Alex Erdman, Bradford Guidance Counselor (Room #246), no later than Tuesday, April 12, 2022. The application must be typed; handwritten applications will not be considered.

Those seniors selected to receive a KBHSAA Scholarship will be notified before May 25, 2022, hopefully at the Senior Recognition event (or via phone call from Joyce Sorensen, Scholarships Chairperson) with a follow-up confirmation letter to include scholarship details and the criteria to be met.

Scholarship recipients for 2022 will be invited to attend the annual DAA Banquet & Silent Auction on Saturday, June 18, 2022 as honored guests of KBHSAA, along with this year's Distinguished Alumni Award recipients.

For all scholarships awarded, payment is made to the recipient after the 1st semester of college is completed and the specific documentation requirements (criteria and grades) are met. All scholarships are non-renewable (i.e., a one-time award), and payment to the recipient will generally occur on or about January 1, 2023.

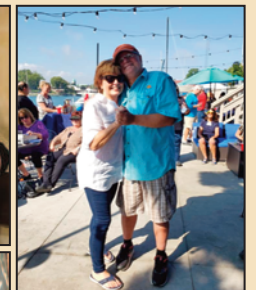

Lost & Found

Some time ago, Robin Mars, Guidance Counselor at Bradford contacted us with a request for assistance in locating the owner of a 1995 Class Ring bearing the name "Chrissie." The note included with the ring indicated the initials engraved inside were CAS or possibly CHS and that Christel Stalker has been contacted, but the ring was not hers.

In late August 2021, we picked up a 1995 Spy from the KBHSAA Archive, and read through the Seniors pictured and not pictured. We zeroed in on trying to locate Christine Spitzer, the only other possible "Chrissie" whose last name that began with "S". A favorite resource for locating classmates turned up a listing for someone listed as "aka" Christine Spitzer, living in Kenosha. The age was right, so we visited the online whitepages and tried the phone number we found... no answer, no voicemail. Instead we opted to send Christine a letter.



Fast forward to October 7 when we received a phone call from Christine. She'd set our letter aside and forgot about it. She identified the ring by telling us the color of the stone in the setting. We met at the 52nd Street Kwik Trip in order to hand deliver the ring. She told us the ring had been stolen from her locker at Bradford 25+ years ago. She smiled as she looked at it, tried it on and was thrilled to have returned.



"Old" Bradford Tours: The End of an Era

Just ahead of publication of the spring Newsletter, KBHSAA heard from Kris

Winzer Miller '73 that she was "retiring" from her honorary position as official tour guide for the school we've fondly referred to as the "old" Bradford. She says, "Most of the classes that wanted to do so have already toured the school. The highlights of the tours have always been the Auditorium, the swimming pool and the Band Room." 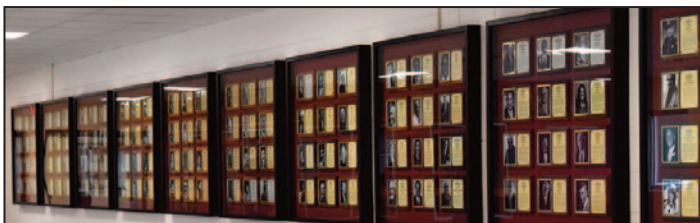
