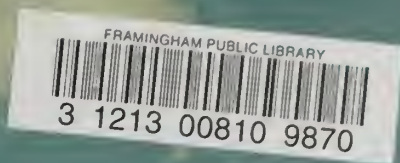




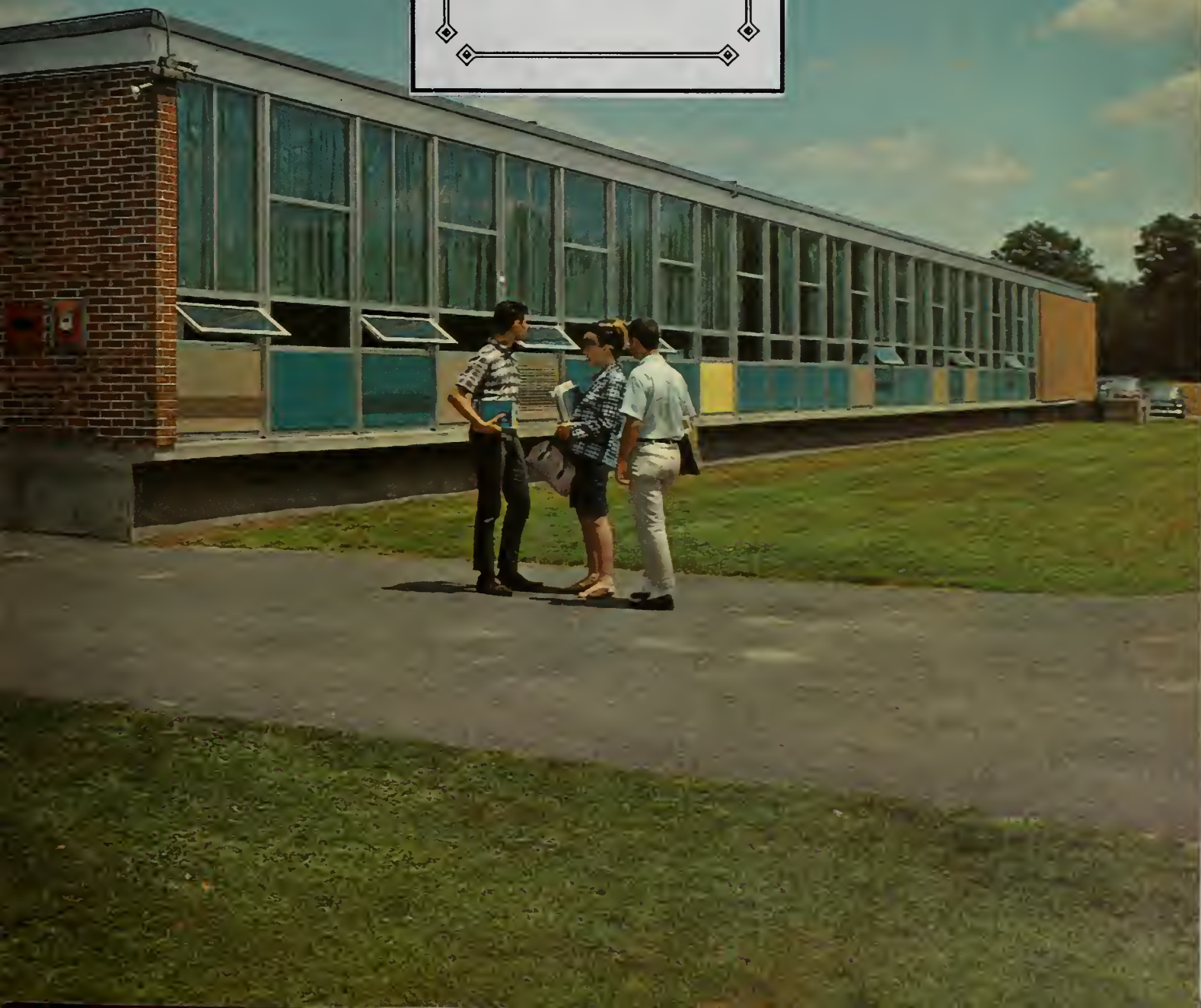

As we are about to open the door to that future which we have been so long anticipating, let us resolve to strive for success in all we attempt so that we may do our part for the betterment and peace of the world.

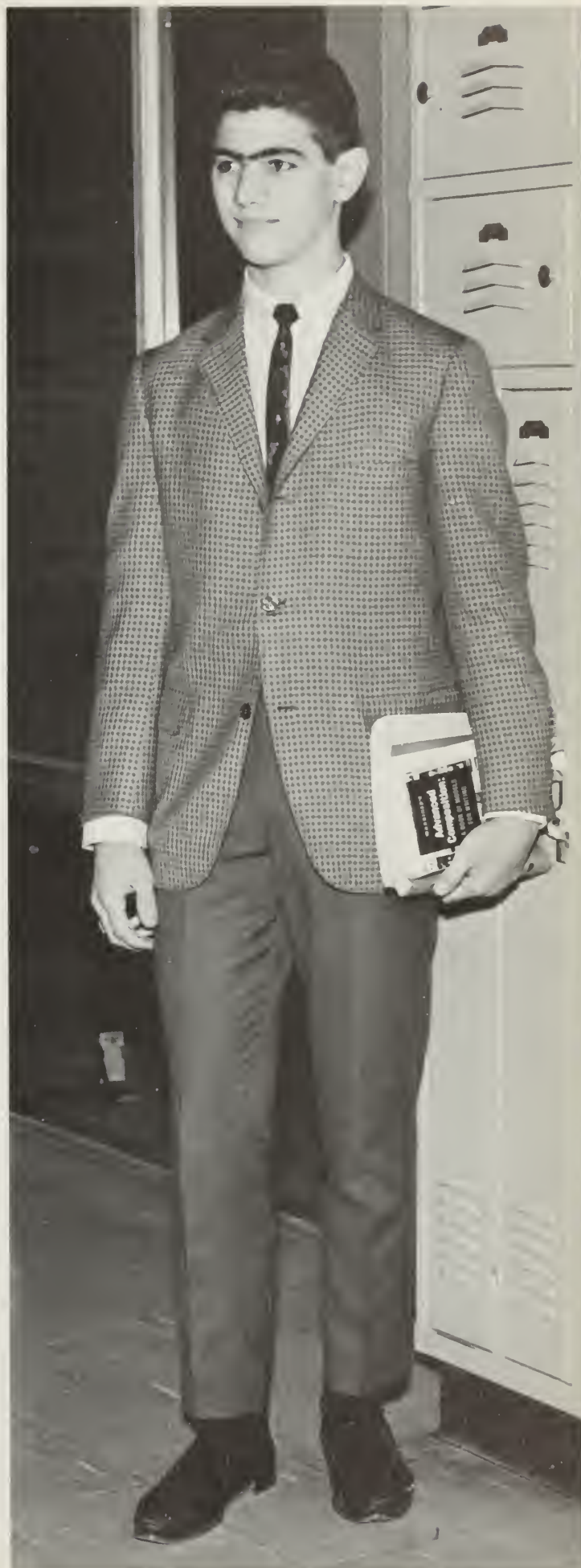

Then and only then shall ye have peace."


