

#### Highland Glen Update-

Over the past few years the Alumni Association has been collecting funds with a plan to construct a Highland Glen garden at the school. The garden was to be a beautiful and relaxing place where alums could visit and quietly reflect on the past and future of HPHS. Alumni have been given an opportunity to purchase items including bricks, benches, shrubs, etc. to add to the beauty of this proposed garden. For quite some time there has been some ongoing restructuring of the school and great uncertainty about whether the original planned location for the garden would remain available or whether the school would have the resources to maintain a garden once it was constructed. The Board of Directors has been patiently monitoring these developments and remained hopeful the Glen project would eventually come to fruition. Unfortunately, it has recently become clear that the project cannot go forward at the proposed location and concept.


In an effort to ensure that funds donated for the Highland Glen project can be used in the spirit in which they were donated, the Board has met with the current school administration and come to an agreement to pursue a new project. It involves a large statue of the Scotsman and a Scotty dog in a garden-like setting located on the west side of the school just north of the main entrance. A sketch of the design is below. While significantly smaller in scale, this area should provide benefits similar to those of the Highland Glen design and will be more visible and accessible to all who visit the school.

The Board plans to use funds already donated for the Glen to construct this new project and those donations which were

made for specific items such as a bench or bricks will still be utilized as requested. The Board is disappointed the original Highland Glen project will not be completed, but is excited and enthusiastic about the new alternative. The Board hopes you share our views and will be interested in contributing to help make this new Glen one we can be proud of and enjoy.

## 2012 Hall of Fame -

The Alumni Association had the privilege of inducting John Williams Saunders III, Victoria Seeger and Freddy Maisberger III as the 2012 Hall of Fame Recipients.

#### John William Saunders III

John William Saunders III is a graduate of the Highland Park High School Class of 1956. John was born in Kansas City, Kansas and attended Perry Rural High School before transferring to Highland Park High School. He had four siblings Merlin known as "Butch", Joyce, Norma Jean and Bobby. While at Highland Park High School he was a football tackle, participated in basketball and track and a member of the Stamp, Radio and Chess/Checkers clubs.

While working in California John got the acting bug. Known as John Quade character actor, he appeared in nearly 130 films, television shows and series, commercials, and on theatre and stage work. He is best known as playing Cholla, leader of the Black Widows motorcycle gang in the hit film Every Which Way But Loose, other memorable films include The Outlaw Josey Wales, and High Plains Drifter with his long lifetime friend Clint Eastwood, The Sting with Paul Newman, and Papillon with Steve McQueen and Dustin Hoffman and as the bartender in La Bamba. Television series included Bonanza, Rockford Files, Gunsmoke, Kojak, McCloud, Starsky & Hutch, and television movies and series such as Roots, The Godfather I, II, III and many more. The list of his appearances whether it was on television appearing in a series, the movies of the week, commercials or on theatre and stage he seemed to be the man that had the look and could fill the part of either the villain or the funny side kick characters. John's list of appearances is impressive and he was perfect for the parts.

John married Gwendolyn Taber-Rice and is the father of six children John IV, Joseph, Steven, Heather, Katherine and Rebecca. John passed away on August 9, 2009 of natural causes at his home in Rosamond, California. His work is still enjoyed today and his commitment to the film industry through his acting, producing, and writing will be remembered by his colleagues, friends, and family and of course his fans.

#### Victoria Seeger

Victoria Seeger graduated from Highland Park High School in 1972. During high school, she was in the Future Business Leaders of America and participated in drill team. She hadn't entertained the idea of attending college until her senior year and then knew her goal was to go to college. She focused on academics most of her time at Highland Park.

Vicki obtained a Bachelor of Arts, Vocational Home Economics Education degree from Washburn University in 1976. For 19 years she worked in the business community as a secretary before returning to school and obtaining her Bachelor of Education in Elementary Education from Washburn University in 1995. She completed her Masters Degree in Curriculum and Instruction from Washburn University in 2005 and her Doctorate of Philosophy (Curriculum and Instruction) from Kansas State University in 2009. Vicki is currently an assistant professor at Northwest Missouri State University.

Vicki worked for the Seaman Unified School District 345 for over 14 years. She taught 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th grade classes at Pleasant Hill Elementary School and was the Literacy and Instructional Coach.

Vicki has received national and state recognition over the years and served on various committees.

Vicki has been privileged of being an author of several books over the years. She has been the co-presenter at various education conferences in St. Louis, Chicago, Las Vegas, San Diego, Tucson, New Orleans, and Omaha.

Vicki is married to Ron Seeger, also 1972 alum of Highland Park. They have two children who are married. Katie and her husband, Chris, live in Prairie Village. Katie is an interior designer for Black and Veatch. Samuel is married to Erin, and he is a graduate student in architecture at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor. When she has time away from work, she enjoys quilting, sewing, cooking, and reading.

#### Freddy Maisberger III

Friedrich Maisberger III known as Freddy graduated from Highland Park High School in 1985. He came through Unified School District 501attending Eisenhower Middle School and Linn Elementary School. While attending high school Freddy participated in wrestling and track.

Following high school Freddy enrolled at Washburn University. While attending college he decided to enlist in the United States Air Force/Kansas Air National Guard. In 1988 he left Topeka to attend basic training at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas followed by technical school at Shepard Air Force Base Wichita Falls, Texas graduating with honors from both. Upon his return he was stationed at the Kansas Air National Guard 190th Air Refueling Wing at Forbes Field in the Repair and Reclamation shop. He was called to duty to serve during the Persian Gulf War in 1991. Freddy enjoyed his 20 years of service with the Kansas Air National Guard 190th Air Refueling Wing until his retirement in March 2008.

Freddy returned to Washburn University graduating in 1992 with a Bachelor of Arts majoring in History with minors in Political Science, Science and English. In 2005 he graduated from Baker University with a Master of Arts in Education. In 1993 Freddy was hired by Unified School District No. 501 at Eisenhower Middle School as a social studies teacher. He is a constant educator and mentor to his students challenging them to believe and become more than the expectation based on their social and economic status.

Freddy has served as the Social Studies Department Head since 2007, on the Social Studies Curriculum Assessment Committee for the District for secondary education, and the liaison for the Highland Park High School Alumni Association.

Freddy coach's three sports during the school year which include wrestling, cross country and track.

When Freddy is not teaching or coaching, he spends time with his wife Shawn (Highland Park graduate of 1984) and their two children Lauren who is 16 years old and Freddy IV who is 12 years old.
