Worry proved needless the night of the game. Head coach Dave Ketchum perceptively brought his umbrella, prepared for nature's tears of pity for the juniors. There were no stars in the sky, they were on the field. Disguised in white jerseys, they shone so brightly the opposition seemed blinded. With nary a pass, the seniors darted to a dazzling 30-0 victory. Diane Schenk and Allyson Anthony, aided by Peggy Traxels' magnet hands snatching interceptions, a defense comparable to a rushing block wall holding the junior offense to one first down in the entire game and nothing on the scoreboard, and an unbelievably excellent offensive line, scored the double digits that made history. Swaying to the Sounds of Time, the Princess Louise held its precious cargo of holiday struck couples and floated them through a memorable Christmas Dance.

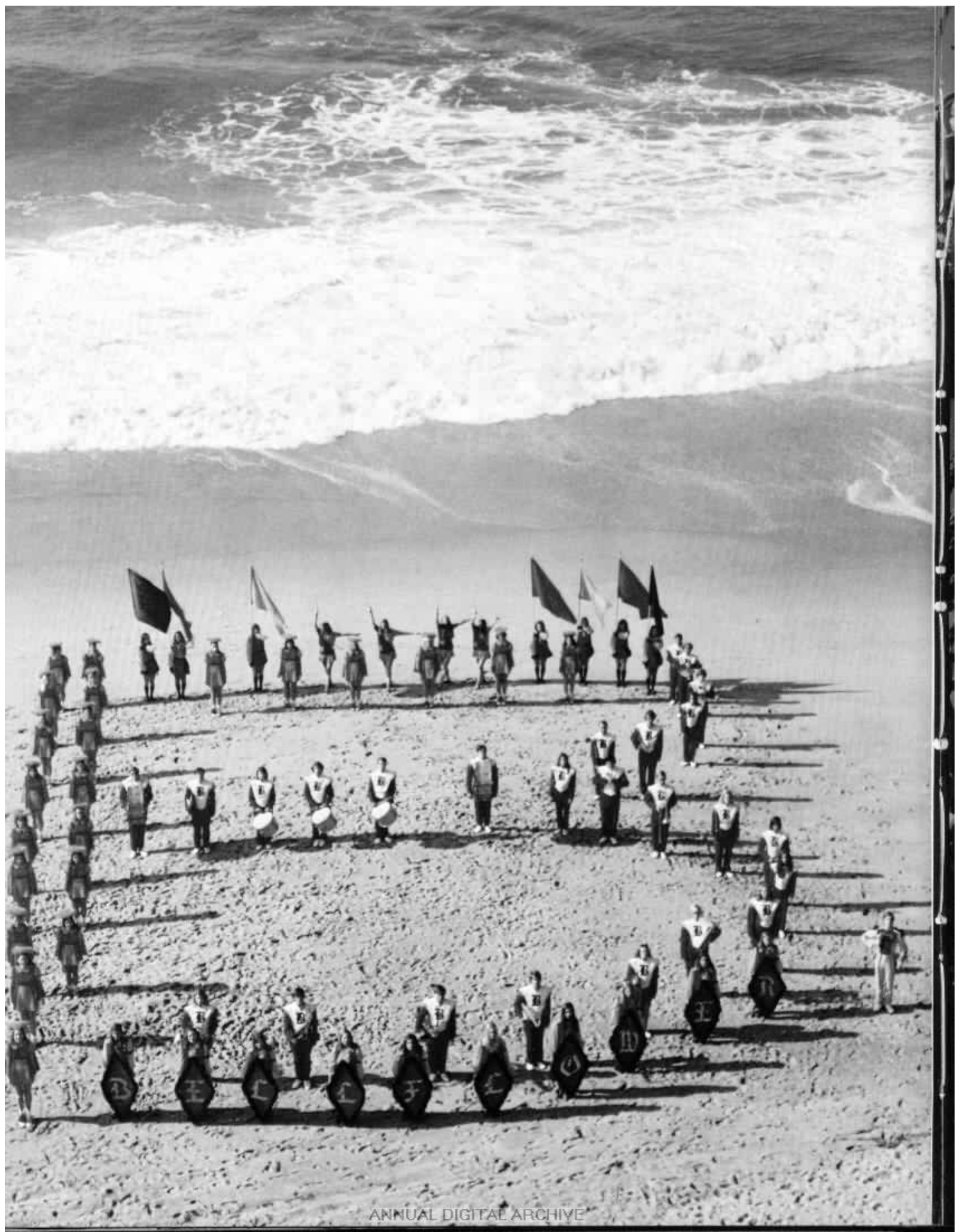




SINGING VALENTINES

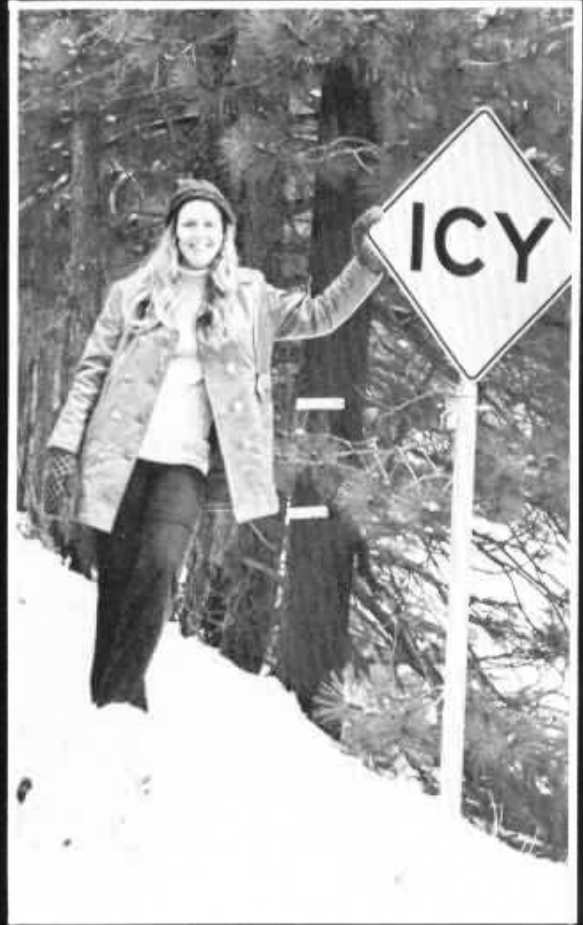

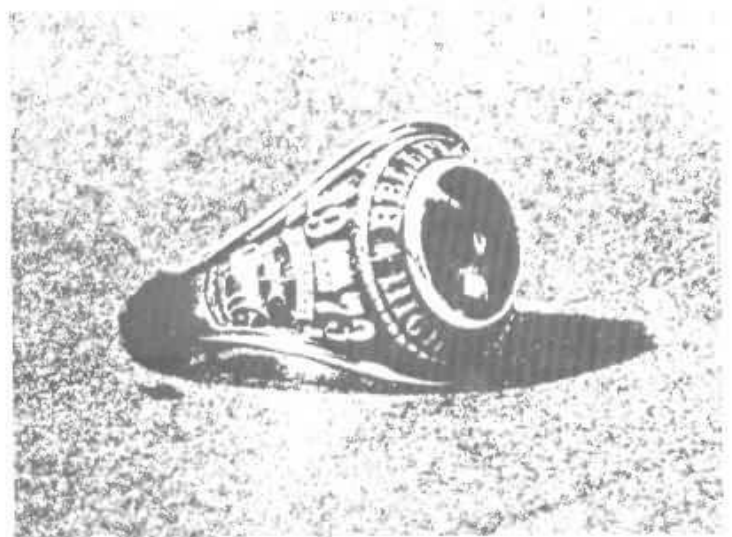
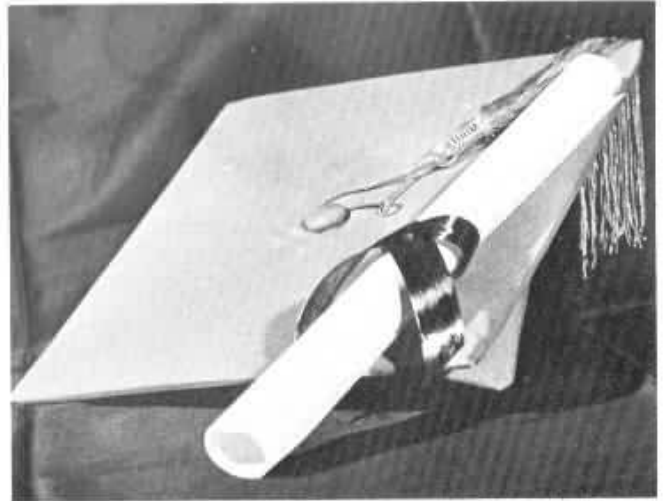


ROMANCE AND ROSES

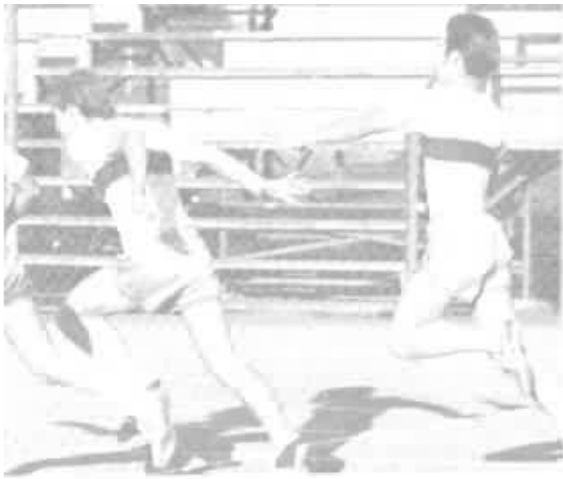

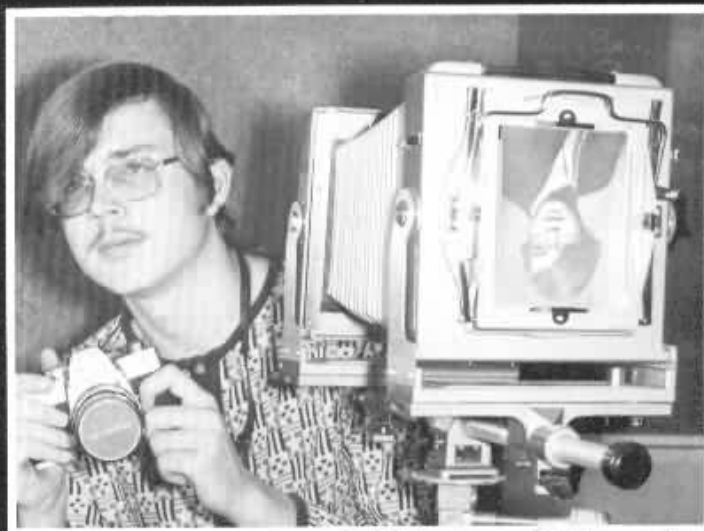
IN RECOGNITION FOR EXCELLENCE IN THE FIELD OF FINE ARTS
